Decision Day

As a reminder, students who completed the application by the November 15 deadline, completed the SSAR by the December 1 deadline, and submitted ACT/SAT scores by the December 15 deadline will receive their decision online on Friday, February 9, after 6 p.m. Students may check their application status from our website, www.admissions.ufl.edu. Only admitted students will receive official notification through the mail. All students admitted to UF must confirm enrollment by May 1. Please note, for students living on campus there is a separate fee for the housing deposit. The housing deposit is not confirmation of enrollment.

Pre-College Summer Programs for High School Students

Encourage academically talented, motivated, and mature students to experience Life as a Gator at one of UF's Center for Precollegiate Education and Training 2018 Summer Programs.

Gator Computing Program: Two-week non-residential program focusing on the pervasive role of computing in the modern world. Students will engage with researchers from the engineering, social sciences, medical research, and biotechnology disciplines. During week one of the program, students will learn how to use computational tools to solve problems. Then, in week two, students will work to solve a problem in small project teams. This program is sponsored by UF Information Technology. June 4 - 8 & June 11-15



Research Explorations: Two-week residential research program for students entering the 11th or 12th grade. Two tracks will be offered in summer 2018: Biomedical and Environmental Toxicology. Connect with UF researchers, participate and learn research techniques in your selected track and explore career opportunities. July 8 - 20



Florida Youth Institute: One-week residential leadership program in agricultural, life sciences, and natural resources for students entering the 11th or 12th grade. Participate in indoor and outdoor laboratories, lessons, and demonstrations; reflect on worldwide challenges such as food security; examine issues pertaining to agriculture, life science, and natural resources; and meet with state agriculture leaders. Sponsored by the Florida Department of Agricultural and in partnership with the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences at UF. Two sessions: July 15-20 or July 22-27



Humanities and the Sunshine State: One-week residential program exploring how the role of water has shaped Florida's history and influences its future. This program is for students entering the 11th or 12th grade. Visit historical landmarks, learn about social justice issues, speak with experts in the field of the humanities, learn how to do humanities work, and engage in discussions with faculty, graduate students, and peers as you learn to tell Florida water stories. Sponsored by the Florida Humanities Council and in partnership with the Center for the Humanities and Public Sphere and the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. June 17-23



Research Immersion in Science and Engineering: One week residential program that introduces students in the iterative cycle of innovations in science and engineering. Students visit active research laboratories and facilities, attend discussions highlighting current research at UF, and participate in hands-on activities and experiments with leading UF research faculty and graduate students. A culminating group project encourages collaborative learning, synthesis of ideas and technologies learned at UF, and the development of new project ideas. June 17-22

Student Science Training Program: Seven-week residential research participation program for students entering the 12th grade and at least 16 years old. Participate in the on-going research of a UF Faculty mentor's lab for 30 hours a week, attend daily lectures by prominent researchers, and participate in a UF Honors Seminar in Scientific Inquiry. Florida high school students may be eligible for 6 college credits. June 10 - July 28

International Admissions

The International Sub-Organizations are the heart and soul of VISA (Volunteers For International Student Affairs). Comprised of upwards of 4,500 undergraduate, graduate, and PhD students from across all disciplines, they represent cultures from all around the world. The University of Florida is incredibly lucky to have such a diverse and vibrant international presence on campus, and we encourage all students to take advantage of the opportunity to learn about other cultures. Each organization holds events throughout the year and partakes in the VISA International Month, hosted in March and April.
